CLUB EVENTS

The next lecture of the 1916 Committee will be on Friday evening, April 5 th at the Ceilidhe Club, starting at 7:30 pm.

The title of our presentation is "Immigration: Then and Now". Pat Brady and Jim McGetrick will take a contrasting look at the immigration of people driven out of their native lands over the centuries. Pat will address the issues involved in Irish immigration during the Famine and post Famine years with special attention will be paid to the more than three thousand people evicted from their homes in Strokestown in 1848. Jim will look at the migration of people from Central America, Guatemala during the more recent past.

We will examine such factors as incentives for migration, political and economic causes, the nature of the journey to the new country as well as the reception at the destination.

By comparing and contrasting these two major examples of migration, it is hoped that lessons learned by the Irish generations ago, can be applied to today's situation where so many migrants are fleeing Central America for a multitude of reasons, many of which parallel the Irish immigrant experience. The lecture will be followed by a question and answer session.

Also, Sean Connell will be performing in the downstairs pub as well.
